It is thought that Highland games originated from Scottish clans competing against each other in various sporting events, with clan chiefs selecting their strongest, fastest, fittest and most entertaining men to represent the clan.

The formalization of Highland games and their establishment as annual event dates from the 1820s.

Modern Clans provide information of their heritage, search for Clan Members and provide a family friendly environment to learn some history and legends of Scotland! You can see many weapons, armor and artifacts as you stroll through the clan area.

Don't miss the Clans as they march in the Parade of Tartans, 12pm on Saturday, join us for the Kirkin O' the Tartan after the Parade of Tartans at 12:00pm on Sunday.



Highland Dancing Competition

The Reuel Zielke Highland Dance Stage

Highland Dancing provides participants the opportunity to gain poise, self-confidence, stage presence, ethnic tradition, uniqueness, self-discipline, aerobic exercise, lifelong friendships and a variety of other positive benefits. Dancers need not be of Scottish heritage to participate.

Many of the Highland Dances trace their beginnings to times of war and were performed by the Scottish soldiers. The Sword Dance is the prediction dance, said to have been done prior to battle. It was believed that if the soldier touched or displaced the sword in

any way it was a bad omen. The Highland Fling is the victory dance done on the "targe" (shield) of the defeated warrior. The Sean Triubhas came about in the rebellion of 1745 when the English forbid the Scots to wear their kilts. This dance represents the repeal of the act and the return to wearing the beloved kilt.

Join us in the Expo Center Arena for Primary, Beginner and Novice events on Saturday morning and Intermediate and Premier events on Saturday afternoon. At the conclusion of the morning dancing and prior to the beginning of the afternoon dancing we will feature solo choreography, where the dancers create their own steps, select their own music, and come up with their own costuming.



Pipes and Drums



Champion Supreme Pipe & Drum Competition Saturday, Massed Bands at 5:30 pm

This is perhaps the most traditional experience associated with Scottish Highland Games. The sound of bagpipes can be heard far and wide! The bagpipes are thought to have originated among sheepherding people of the Mediterranean before the time of Christ. The pipes made their way to Scotland in the 13th Century.

Piping judges base their scoring on tuning and playing ability including finger control and regulated blowing to fill the bag. The pipe band's drum corps includes snare, tenor, and bass drums. They are judged on creative performance as well as technical ability. Come back to the Pipe Field for Massed bands and prepare to be awe inspired as all the bands gather to play your traditional bagpipe favorites.

Free instruction in battle axe and knife throwing all day.

That's right, real axe throwing! Stop by the Battle Axe area and get some training on how to throw both axes and throwing knives at a wooden target --- then take a few stabs at it!


The herding demonstrations are a must see! Sit back and enjoy as Shannon explains and demon-





On Saturday and Sunday, starting at 2 PM, watch as men, women and youth compete in a St. George's Charge Match and the Scottish Clout. Precompetition meeting at 1:30 PM.

The **St. George's Charge Match** consists of 2 ends of 6 arrows at each of the following distances starting at 40 yards, 30 yards and 20 yards. The **Scottish Clout** consists of 2 ends of 6 arrows at 125 yards and 180 yards.

<u>We are looking for archers to compete!</u> Either longbows or recurves are welcome. Sights, releases or counter weights are <u>NOT</u> allowed.

AGAIN THIS YEAR: Lyle Maryniak will teach archery instruction for the blind, giving them an experience at something new and we have blind archers competing Saturday.

From ROME to Wassace

Aglimpse of Celtic Warfare throughout the ages

From Rome to Wallace is a synopsis of Celtic History and its profound influence on historical warfare from 300 B.C to the High Middle Ages. The Celt's were the quintessential warriors to the settled and "civilized" peoples of the Mediterranean, Europe and Asia. The Romans especially feared them but they would learn from them and use that knowledge to conquer the known world. We will also look at the barbaric tribes who greatly influenced Scotland's martial culture like the Picts, Saxons, Vikings and Gaels. They would play an important part in shaping the fighting spirit of the elite Highland Warriors in the time of Sir William Wallace and Scotland's on going fight for independence.



Gryphon Poursuivant

(reenactment troupe)

The mission of Gryphon Poursuivant is to bring the history of the European Renaissance to life. Our goal is to educate both the young and old on the daily life of a siege encampment. To this end, we diligently try to incorporate all daily living activities along with the military aspect of a company of siege engineers. We offer various interactive areas including cooking, brewing, use of siege weapons, small arms and armor, indoor and outdoor games and simple musical instruments. In the end we strive to have the patron walk away with a better sense of how people lived and functioned in a mobile military siege encampment during the 16th century.

Heavy Athletics

Heavy athletics refer to the athletic events which require significant strength and power, as opposed to the light athletics, which require stamina, such as highland dancing, sprinting, running, and jumping. Heavy athletics include stone-throwing, weight tossing, hammer-throwing and caber turning.

Turning the Caber

There are no uniform standards for cabers. Traditionally though, the caber is 16 to 20 feet in length and weighs 80 to 130 pounds with the largest caber throw on record being 280 lbs. The size, and particularly the length, of the caber means that enormous strength is required simply to balance it vertically, and even more is required to toss it.

The object is **not the distance** of the throw, but rather to have the

caber fall directly away from the thrower after the landing. A perfect throw ends with the 'top' end nearest to the thrower and the 'bottom' end pointing exactly away. If the throw is not perfect, it is scored by viewing the caber as though it were the hour hand on a clock. A perfect toss is 12:00. If the caber lands on its end and falls back towards the thrower, the score is lower than for any throw that falls away from the thrower.

Steps of the Caber Turn

The 'pick' where the competitor lifts the caber off the ground.

The 'approach' where the athlete gets momentum going by running forward.

The 'plant' when both feet take root to provide a good throwing platform.

The 'toss' where the caber is actually flipped end over end (or at least attempted).


